

Br. Joseph grew up in Modesto and attended the Fra Angelico Chapter at St. Joseph's after his conversion from atheistic agnosticism in 2011 up to the time of his call to discern the priesthood in 2012. He is a graduate of Modesto Junior College with an AA in Behavioral and Social Sciences (2012), a graduate of Franciscan University of Steubenville with a BA in Theology, minor in Philosophy (2015) and an MA in Theology and Christian Ministry (2016). He joined the Oratorian Community in Formation in Washington, DC in 2019, and he has just completed an ecclesiastical degree in Sacred Theology (STB) at Catholic University of America (2021).

He has written on various topics and spoken in California, Ohio, Pennsylvania, D.C., and Gibraltar on diverse themes, which include: conversion, sin and grace, the Liturgical Year, the Eucharist, the lives of the Saints, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and St. Joseph.

His interest in and love for St. Joseph has propelled him to study and deep contemplation on the father of Our Lord. He has written on St. Joseph as an analogy of God the Father, on the biblical antecedents of St. Joseph's love for the Blessed Virgin, and spoken on St. Joseph's fatherhood, St. Joseph's relationship to our Lady, and St. Joseph as a guide for the Family, St. Joseph's virtues, and St. Joseph in the Theology of St. John Henry Newman.
